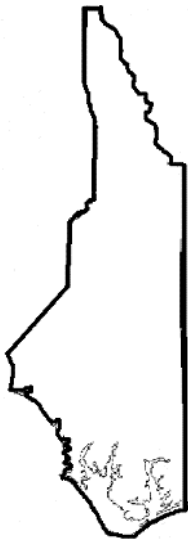


case study: The Everglades

Modifying the Environment: Not-So-Sensitive Modification



Label: Orlando, Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico (Barrier Islands between), Lake Okeechobee, Kissimmee River, Alligator Alley (toll road), and the Everglades



The Everglades was once a very wide and shallow freshwater river: 80 kilometers (50 miles) wide and 15 centimeters (6 inches) deep, flowing south from Lake Okeechobee to the Gulf of Mexico. Demonstrate this on your map with green coloring (blue for water).
